Welcome

The National Debating League (NDL) has established school debating leagues in Cape Town, Johannesburg, East London and Gqeberha. Our programs unite a community of nearly 100 primary and high schools across South Africa and Mozambique.

This information pack will discuss our plans for the Cape Town International Debate Championship.

Overview

The Cape Town International Debate Championship (CT-IDC) is a debating championship open to high school (grade 8 to 12) teams from anywhere in the world. It will be hosted at Hoërskool Jan van Riebeeck in Cape Town over 12-15 December 2024.

We're aiming for more than just a highly competitive competition—we want a *diverse* one too.

Age Divisions

We will have two age divisions:

Group B: Grade 8-9 (typically aged 13-15) Group A: Grade 10+ (typically aged 16+)

Team Composition

Each team may consist of between 3 and 5 speakers. Each team should be accompanied by at least one educator who will join our adjudication panel. This educator will need to have prior experience with the World Schools Style of debate.

Dates

The competition will run on 12-15 December 2024. Teams need to arrive by 5:00pm on 11 December 2024—this will make it possible to attend an orientation briefing for students and adjudicators.

Accommodation

Participants will stay at the Hoërskool Jan van Riebeeck boarding houses. There are separate male and female boarding facilities on the campus. Students and teachers will be allocated to separate areas of each boarding house.

Meals

The registration fee includes all meals outlined on the event schedule (page 4).

Schools should notify us upon registration of any special dietary requirements, such as allergies or religious requirements.

Sightseeing Trips

Two opportunities for sightseeing are included in the registration fee.

- At the end of the second day, participants will be taken for an afternoon trip to Sea Point Beach.
- At the end of the third day, participants will be taken on a sightseeing trip around Cape Town.

Adjudication

Most of our adjudicators will be teachers. We will host an orientation session for adjudicators on 11 December 2024. We will ensure everyone has a common understanding of the format and how to score a debate.

You will always work with a co-judge from another school and you will not adjudicate your own students. Our adjudicators will explain their verdicts to students at the end of each round. They will also offer constructive feedback to each team.

Rounds and Topics

The tournament will consist of 6 preliminary rounds, a Quarter-Final, Semi-Final and Final. Most topics will be "unseen" - this means they will be revealed to participants at the tournament.

Two of our motions will be revealed in advance, along with relevant research links. These will be for the most research-heavy motions.

Electronic Device Usage

During debate prep sessions, teams may not operate electronic devices like smartphones, laptops, tablets or other devices capable of accessing the internet, sending/receiving text messages or viewing digital documents. Teams may, however, bring as many printed resources as they wish.

Pre-released Motion #1:

This house would exempt developing nations from the EU carbon border tax

Context

The European Union's Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) is essentially a carbon tax applied on imported goods. For example, a spoon produced using a coal-powered electrical grid will be taxed to account for the carbon emitted during the production of the spoon and it's operation of it's supply chain.

Pre-released Motion #2

Pre-released Motion #2:

This house believes that all countries in the world should adopt unconditional jus soli as the primary method of acquiring citizenship

Context

Countries around the world have developed their own criteria for determining how citizenship is awarded to newborn children.

Definition

Jus soli, meaning "right of the soil" in Latin, is where citizenship is automatically granted to anyone born in a country's territory, regardless of their parents' citizenship status. This can be thought of as citizenship by birthplace. For example, Mexico grants citizenship automatically to anyone born on its soil.

One alternative is jus sanguinis, meaning "right of blood". Here, citizenship is determined by your parents' citizenship, regardless of where you're born. So, if your parents are citizens of a country, you automatically become one too, even if you were born elsewhere. For example, in Qatar, only children born to a Qatari father automatically receive Qatari citizenship, regardless of their birthplace.

- Any awards won.


Registration Deadlines
